## LINK NEWS

**Sustainable Land Use Strategy** – LINK is preparing its response to the consultation on the <u>draft</u> <u>Land Use Strategy</u> published in September by the Scottish Government, which LINK regards as inadequate. Take part in a debate on the strategy with MSPs at LINK's *Living with the Land* conference next Monday 8<sup>th</sup> November, at the Scottish Storytelling Centre in Edinburgh. **LINK 2010 Members Congress -** 18<sup>th</sup> November, Dunblane Book your place at LINK's annual Congress. This year's theme *is Environment and the Law* and the programme will include a review of environmental legislation enacted since Devolution. **Strategic Planning meeting**, 19 November, Dunblane – This is the network's annual planning day and we hope your organisation will field someone to the discussions. Papers will be circulated shortly. LINK's current Operating Plan is available <u>here</u>

**LINK-SNH Chair-level liaison meeting** recently agreed the organisations should keep more closely in touch about their concerns and roles in relation to the environment in Scotland. Simon Pepper (SNH Board Member) was present. Simon is being tasked with exploring SNH relationships with the eNGOs and would welcome observations from members on where this is not as straightforward as they would hope (you can email him direct at <a href="mailto:srpepper@tiscali.co.uk">srpepper@tiscali.co.uk</a> ). Simon will attend LINK Strategic Planning on 19 November to discuss this with members. Meantime, LINK Board also hopes to liaise more closely with the senior management team at SNH with a view to ensuring the Agency and the network are more aware of each other's concerns and plans.

LINK Board has signed off Andy Myles' Political Strategy Report (view it <u>here</u>) agreeing that the focus of the next few months is rightly on governance and on how to press for the environment to be protected through a time of austerity. With the Scottish Budget Bill due around 18th November, our 'budget paper' is being developed further; there will be some press work around this as the Bill is published; members will be invited to a December meeting to discuss our asks and tactics further. LINK's two papers on the budget cuts and governance will be circulated to members shortly for feedback.

**SOA task force** will launch our audit of SOAs (commissioned from CAG consultants; final report due with LINK in November) in mid January and are working with SNH to organise a seminar on the SOA process, with CPPs, CoSLA, Improvement Service and others, in February.

**Fred Edwards Trust** launched on 25th October with several excellent 'cameos' of Fred and the Inaugural Lecture by Prof Aubrey Manning. Audience of around 200, with good degree of interest in the Trust and its proposed Action Learning Programme and very welcome donations towards its work.
