The Fred Edwards Trust, the charity established to commemorate LINK's former president, Fred Edwards, is holding its launch event on 25th October at the Playfair Library in Edinburgh. Professor Aubrey Manning will be giving its inaugural lecture: "Only connect: is a sustainable human ecology possible?". More information to follow.

Wildlife and Natural Environment Bill - Stage one is now under way at Holyrood. The bill is being scrutinised by the Rural Affairs and Environment Committee who have put out a call for evidence, with a deadline of 1st September. In addition, Scottish Environment LINK has been invited to provide a panel of four experts to provide oral evidence to the committee on the 15th September. We are expecting the evidence gathering portion of stage one to be completed by Autumn recess. The LINK WaNE group is meeting to discuss our approach to the bill on the 12th August at LINK offices in Perth at 3pm. Interested members are welcome to attend, please contact <u>Susan</u>

LINK's Single Outcome Agreement Taskforce has put a brief for an audit on SOAs in Scotland out to tender. The audit will evaluate how sustainable development and environment are being addressed by each Community Planning Partnership in the Single Outcome Agreements 2009-12, to determine emerging trends in the lead up to the next local and national elections.

The **Sustainable Land Use Strategy Taskforce** has fixed a date for a one day conference during the consultation period for the draft strategy – 8th November at the Scottish Storytelling Centre in Edinburgh.



Climate Adaptation – <u>Jim Densham</u> of RSPB has offered to convene this new Taskforce and will contact interested members shortly to arrange its first meeting.

Listing and marketing of conservation and amateur varieties of vegetables: FERA is inviting views on the implementation of Commission Directive 2009/145/EC on conservation and amateur varieties of vegetables and its impact on unlisted vegetable varieties. The overall aim of the Directive is to promote the sustainable use of plant genetic resources, that is traditionally grown varieties and landraces and varieties of 'no intrinsic value for crop production but developed for growing under particular conditions'. In practice, this means encouraging the marketing of conservation (or heritage) varieties and of varieties intended specifically for amateur gardeners. Closing date 29th October. Details here

JOINT Links Reports - April to June

WildLife and Countryside Link

Following the General Election Link attended two meetings with the new Secretary of State for Environment, Caroline Spelman MP, taking the opportunity to outline some of Link's key priorities. This quarter Link has responded to a number of consultations, including the <u>public debate</u> on the future of the CAP after 2013, Defra's consultation on <u>European pesticides legislation</u>, and the Department for Communities and Local Government consultation on <u>Planning for a natural and</u>



<u>healthy environment</u>. We also submitted a <u>Joint Links response</u> to the pre-consultation discussion paper on the draft UK Marine Policy Statement.

In May Link's Land Use Planning Group hosted a workshop on the future of planning and the Marine Legislation Group published a new leaflet; <u>Marine Planning Principles</u>.

Link produced a <u>briefing on mobile marine species</u> and in the lead up to <u>The 62nd Annual Meeting of the International Whaling Commission</u> (IWC62) in June, sent briefings to Defra officials on <u>Key issues for the 62nd meeting of the IWC</u> and <u>NGO Priority Issues for IWC62</u>. A number of Link members attended IWC62 and two Link/NGO representatives joined the UK IWC delegation.

At the Defra Joint NGO Liaison Group meeting of conservationists and traders in May, the Chair of Link's Wildlife Trade Group made a statement on behalf of Link, thanking the UK delegation for efforts during CoP15, and recognising the difficulties that were faced around EU coordination.

Link's Management Committee held an action-packed away day in June at Plantlife's offices in Salisbury, where discussions focused on up-coming work priorities for Link, including the Natural Environment White Paper and our response to the spending cuts.

Northern Ireland Environment Link

This is NIEL's 20th anniversary and we celebrated at our AGM and annual conference on 'Northern Ireland's Freshwater Environment; Rivers don't run free!' Held on 23 June. In preparation we had our Annual Report, but also prepared a major report for funders on the last five years of our work and are nearly finished developing a new Strategic Plan for the next three years.

In addition and in support of this we are undertaking significant work on improving our efficiency and effectiveness in the way we run the office and the organization. We are submitting funding applications for both NIEA and Esmee Fairbairn Foundation, and have submitted an application to the Building Change Trust on facilitating the eNGO sector to evolve to deal with funding pressures and deliver improved messages to promote societal change in behaviour. We have commissioned a report on the eNGO sector in Northern Ireland which is moving along slowly which will also help in our efforts to ensure that the sector thrives despite funding pressures and is able to deliver improved environmental outputs.

We are also 'coordinating lead author' for the Northern Ireland chapter of the UK National Ecosystem Assessment which is a major piece of work but which should ultimately be a strong tool for environmental protection. The NI Sustainable Development Strategy has finally been adopted, and work continues on an Implementation Plan which will be consulted on over the summer. The Forestry Bill is now law, and the Wildlife and Environment Bill is progressing, with further deliberations planned for the autumn; hare coursing is to be banned, but the hare will not be granted additional protection and snares will not be banned. Numerous other legislation is progressing, although the Review of Public Administration is 'suspended' and will not proceed in its entirety by the target time of 2011.
