Invite and Alert to Species Champion Bat Walk

Celebrate the Year of Natural Scotland with a sunset saunter to meet some of Scotland's wonderful bats... and some wonderful MSPs who are championing threatened species across Scotland.

Members of Scottish Parliament have been invited by Scottish Environment LINK's Wildlife Forum Species Champion initiative on a Bat Walk this evening along with bat experts and The walk will be led by Anne Youngman, Scottish Officer for the Bat Conservation Trust with assistance from local bat group members, bat experts and enthusiasts. MSPs will learn to get to grips with bat detectors so they will be able to hear the bats as they socialise and feed.

The walk will start at the Parliament building and continue to Dunsapie Loch where the group hopes to encounter pipistrelle and Daubenton's bats. MSPs have a unique chance to come along and eavesdrop into the normally secret world of bat sounds, chat to some bat experts, meet other species champions and have a memorable night out.

The Species Champion initiative is coordinated by Scottish Environment LINK's Wildlife forum and has invited all MSPs to choose from a list of 93 species that are currently facing significant threats to their future. At present there are 52 Species Champions, across all parties, who are championing a total of 63 species, from fauna, insects, marine and of course bats.

Species on the list include the beautiful Brown Longeared bat and the little known Leisler's and Nathusius pipistrelle bats. Other animals and plants are included such as the critically endangered freshwater pearl and the twin flower. Each of the listed species is currently affected by a range of human impacts such as development-driven habitat loss, climate change and pollution. Anne Youngman, Scottish Officer for the Bat Conservation Trust said "I'm thrilled to have six MSPs championing our Scottish Bat species. Bats here face particular challenges due to our harsher climate and short summer nights. They are such tiny creatures they can be out of sight and out of mind or worse still misunderstood and feared. Having six well known voices speak up for bats in a positive and well informed way is a great boost to bat conservation and to the work of the Bat Conservation Trust in Scotland. "

With this initiative LINK hopes to push Scotland's nature up the political agenda during the Year of Natural Scotland and ensure that Scotland's environment is respected and protected for the benefits it brings to society: from tourist-attracting landscapes and clean water to crop pollination and food production.
