
SUMMARY - LINK Food and Farming Group: facilitated workshop 17th May to agree the top 5 advocacy asks behind LINK's agricultural subsidy work, towards a new system . HEADLINE: Over half a billion pounds of public money is currently being spent on farming with no strings attached - we need to transform the current funding system for farming to support farmers to adopt climate- and nature-friendly practices, while producing food in a sustainable way. 


An increase in the amount of funding spent on advice, knowledge transfer and training (to 20% of the budget) to help the industry adapt and change.

An increase in organic farming in Scotland by x% by 2030

No more than 10% of farm funding should be spent on basic farm support (compared to 44% now) and given only to those farmers and crofters that need it.

The funding for nature and climate friendly farming to include specific, targeted payments that will restore and enhance farmland wildlife that is in decline
