1. Response

Do you have any feedback on the proposed introduction of fixed penalty notices for offences under The Environmental Protection (Single-Use Vapes) (Scotland) Regulations 2024, the Environmental Protection (Single-use Plastic Products) (Scotland) Regulations 2021, the Environmental Protection (Cotton Buds) (Scotland) Regulations 2019 and the Environmental Protection (Microbeads) Regulations 2018?

Scottish Environment LINK members support the proposals to allow enforcement officers to issue fixed penalty notices in relation to the sale of single-use vapes. Single-use vaping products are responsible for significant resource waste including the use of lithium and other metals necessary for the transition to Net Zero, as well as consisting largely of fossil-fuel derived plastic. Additionally, single-use vapes are the fastest growing litter item in Scotland.

The banning of single-use vapes is a necessary and proportionate measure and it is appropriate that penalties are introduced for any trader in breach of these regulations. As well as regulatory provision, the Scottish Government must also ensure that local authorities are adequately resourced and otherwise supported in enforcing these regulations.
